 - a. <u>Matter 1</u>: The request letter from Dr. Anurag to approve the compassionate use of Tofacitinib and Bevacizumab for COVID patients in the absence of availability of CDSCO approved drugs like Tocilizumab from government and the market for severe COVID-19 infections in view of the possible therapeutic benefits. It was discussed that compassionate use of these drugs in emergency may considered on a case to case basis as recommended by the WHO. As per the WHO guidelines (MEURI and scientific brief on emergency use of offlabel drugs in pandemic), EC has the authority to approve such use along with approval from regulatory authorities.

Decision: It was unanimously decided to approve Dr. Anurag's request, subject to receiving approval from DCGI and to follow the guidelines of WHO. Member-Secretary to draft the reply and get it approved by Chairperson before communicating with the applicant.

- 10) Why did the PI choose to use a resistant strain such as MRSA and a sensitive strain of E. coli, it would be good if the PI had used standard strain of staphylococcus.
- B) Title of the project: Evaluation of the efficacy of manual and mechanical instrumentation in regaining apical patency during retreatment: an in vitro study (Ref. No. YU-IBSC-005/2020). The principal investigator Dr. Reshma Pradeep, Final year PG, Dept. of conservative dentistry and endodontics, YDC, Yenepoya University presented the proposal.

Following questions were raised:

- 1) What are statistical analytical methods will the PI use to evaluate the three methods (Instrument)? in regaining apical patency
- 2) How did the PI come to the conclusion on number of sample size (14/14)?
- 3) How does this current study taken up by the PI differ from other studies done so far?
- 4) What is the percentage of EDTA solution used for washing the samples? Since the PI is going to use 17% EDTA + Hypochlorite solution (2.5%), one of the members had raised this question and has asked the PI to recheck on the strength of EDTA solution which is to be used before going ahead with the work.

All the members came to the conclusion that there are no biosafety issues in the two proposals presented. Both the projects will be approved once all the questions raised by the members are answered satisfactorily and changes are incorporated in the proposal and submitted again.

The committee decided to convene the next meeting within next 6 months

Finally, the chairman thanked all the members for their inputs on the projects and discussion and concluded the meeting as closed at 3:00 pm.

- > Prof. Wani: What's the age group of patients selected?
- > Dr. Sharan's answer: Average age group will be 12-17 years of permanent teeth.
- > Prof. Wani: 12 will be too young individual as already there will be a lot of regenerative potential in dental pulp stem cells from that young individuals.
- > Dr. Sharan's answer: We are collecting teeth from individuals indicated for orthodontic extraction, who are mostly adolescents & young adults and root apex would have already matured.
- > Dr. Wani: The PI should consider taking old individuals only where they can see the benefit of PRP and PRF. Please comment
- > Dr. Sharan's answer: As the clinical applicability of regenerative endodontics is mostly in young individuals we have considered it. However, in future we will consider adult pulp as well
- > Prof. Wani: Are you going to use the suboptimal doses of PRPs and PRFs to observe synergistic effects?
- > Dr. Sharan's answer: Yes- A standardization will be made
- > Dr. Sheetal Ullal: Since you will be supported by Orthodontics department? Do you have a written understanding with them? If yes, a copy of that should be attached as an annexure to this proposed protocol.
- > Dr. Sharan's answer: There is no need to have an understanding with orthodontics department, since the patients requiring extraction are referred to our own department or oral surgery department.

Clarifications from the committee:

- Dr. Rameela: Your inclusion criteria for the study includes healthy individuals without any history. Will this information be taken before the start of research? What will be the duration you expect the study to be finished?
- Dr. Sharan's answer: Only healthy individuals without any history of systemic illness or under medication will be considered.
- > Dr. Raghu: You are using n=4 groups? Isn't it too much of work?
- Dr. Sharan's answer: We are evaluating the odontogenic differentiation potential of both primary and permanent teeth; hence 4 groups are considering.
- Dr. Bhanu: What is the larger perspective of using the stem cells from the inflamed pulp? What are the underlying causes for pulp inflammation?
- Dr. Sharan's answer: Studies have shown that inflamed pulp tissue can have equal or increased differentiation potential. Dental caries and tooth trauma are the causes of pulp inflammation. Only caries without direct involvement of pulp will be considered.
- Dr. Wani: You are considering young individuals for the study. I would do this kind of study in old individuals as the regenerative potential of dental pulp in young individuals is higher as the proliferation rate of cells is higher unless you are going to use it for allogenic transplantation. Please clarify.
- > Dr. Sharan's answer: We will consider doing the study on older individuals in future.
- Dr. Suresh: Similar studies are carried in the age groups of 6-40 years' individuals. Please comment.
- Dr. Sharan's answer: since we are from dept of paediatric dentistry we are collecting pulp samples from children and adolescents
- Prof. Seshagiri: When you say we are using inflamed pulp tissue. How sure are you, if the pulp tissue is infected? How can you say that the tissue is completely microbes free?
- Dr. Sharan's answer: Standard protocols for asepsis and disinfection will be followed and harvested pulp tissue will be treated with povidine iodine solution.
- Prof. Seshagiri: You have used pluripotent stem cells as terms in the proposal. Which these cells are strictly not. Please change the term.
- > Dr. Sharan's answer: Sure we will change it to multipotent

- Dr.Anirban: What do you mean controlled diabetes individuals? Do you mean controlled diabetes using medicines or life style changes?
- ➤ Dr. Jose's answer: Controlled diabetes individuals are the patient with good glycemic control having HbA1c ≤ 7% either through medication or diet and lifestyle modifications will be included in this study.
- > Dr.Anirban: How severe is diabetes in periodontitis patients? Please clarify
- Dr. Jose' answer: Periodontitis is a microbial disease that is commonly seen in people with poor oral hygiene. The incidence of Periodontitis is 59% more in Diabetic patients with more tissue destruction when compared to non-diabetic people. According to Loe, periodontitis is the sixth complication of diabetes mellitus; the mechanism involved is similar to that of other systemic complications, via inflammatory cytokines. Diabetes and periodontitis are two way connected i.e. periodontitis is more in diabetic patients and periodontitis makes glycemic control in a diabetic patient, difficult.
- Dr. Smita: How do you compare the periodontal ligament stem cells between diabetic vs non-diabetic patients? Please comment
- Dr. Jose' answer: It has been reported that stem cell's regenerative potential is reduced in periodontitis. In diabetic patients, PDLSCs may be further affected by hyperglycemia induced detrimental effect. So the study will evaluate the difference in characteristics of cells from these two conditions, if any.
- Dr. Smita: What is the justification of using different CD markers for your comparisons?
- Dr. Jose' answer: Periodontal ligament stem cells (PDLSC's) is a heterogeneous group costem cells and possess the characteristic of mesenchymal stem cells which has D & CD 90, CD 73, CD 44, CD 31 & CD 105 as a positive CD antigens. So in order to eliminate embryonic stem cells and hematopoietic stem cells from the cells these markers will be used in the study.

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- Prof. Wani: Is there any delayed healing in periodontitis in diabetes patients? If yes, when you characterise you may not see any difference in expression of MSC markers but you may see a difference in differentiation markers.
- Dr. Jose' answer: In diabetes mellitus there will be delayed healing in these patients. As mentioned earlier, it has been reported that stem cell's regenerative potential is reduced in periodontitis. In diabetic patients, PDLSCs may be further affected by hyperglycemia induced detrimental effect. So the study will evaluate the difference in characteristics of cells from these two conditions, if any. In this study we will also be seeing a difference in differentiation markers
- Prof. Wani: These cells you are isolating should be CD34 negative?
- Dr. Jose' answer: CD 34 is a hematopoietic stem cell antigen which is a negative marker in this study.
- Dr. Ullal: Usually, if it is a PG dissertation, the PG should be PI. Please check with the university rules.
- Dr. Jose' answer: As we are applying for the university seed grant, the guide Dr.Maji jose will be the PI and Dr. Sudarvizhi.T will be the co-PI. As the current ICSCR proposal is a PG dissertation Dr.Sudarvizhi.T will be the PI and Dr. Maji Jose will be the co-PI.
- Prof. Seshagiri: How are you going to fund the research?
- Dr. Jose' answer: For evaluating the differentiation potential we will be applying for university seed grant.
- Dr. Smita: Are the consent forms missing for this study and previous proposed protocols? Please clarify?
- Dr. Jose' answer: The informed consent forms and participation information sheets in English and in regional languages was included in the presentation, same will be submitted for Institutional ethical clearance for verification.

Clarifications from the committee:

- Dr. Bhanu: Please clarify how are you going to use the in vitro model system to study the disease prevalence in India? Prof. Seshagiri agreed with Dr. Bhanu. Please clarify and modify the title accordingly.
- Dr. Shenoy's answer: Since this proposal was prepared in a hurry without consulting an Oral Pathologist or a Maxillofacial Surgeon. I now feel the title was not appropriate, so I have modified it as per the suggestions given by IC-SCR members "Establishment and characterization of oral cancer stem cell lines in Oral Squamous Cell Carcinoma (OSCC) in vitro"
- ▶ Dr. Bhanu: 5 samples representing 4 areas is a good idea. But I am not sure considering the variability of disease in patients, if this is enough? Also, I feel 5 samples from 4 areas may give a lot of variability. Please comment.
- > Dr. Shenoy's answer: First of all there is very less information about research conducted on comparison or cells isolated from different areas of oral cavity. It is also extremely difficult to establish epithelial cells (require special media) form each sample. We thought that if we take 5 samples from each area, we will be able to establish cells from at least two samples from each area.
- > Dr. Suresh: Selection of patients can be a bit more specific? What kinds of patients are they going to examine?
- Dr. Shenoy's answer: After consulting Oral Pathologist and Maxillofacial Surgeon we have decided that will be collecting samples from tobacco related and histopathologically proven OSCC lesions from floor of the mouth, surface of the tongue, sides of the tongue, buccal cavity.
- > Dr. Sibi: How is the study going to benefit the patients with advanced oral cancers?
- Dr. Shenoy's answer: There is no benefit to the patients. After going through the literature and consulting the dental surgeon, if we take samples of advanced oral cancers we might be able to establish the cell lines. If we take the samples from early stages the cells may not survive in culture.

Dr. Anirban: Agree with Suresh – Clarification on identification and selection of Spatients is critical and has to be addressed as OSCCs are very heterogeneous

Dr. Shenoy's answer: So here we will be taking samples from only those patients with tobacco related and histo-pathologically proven OSCC. (Cancer cells from floor of the mouth and on the tongue will be more aggressive and cancer cells from the buccal cavity will be less aggressive).

- > Dr. Anirban: How effective would be the in vitro model system to understand the differences between the specialized cells vs. undifferentiated cells?
- Dr. Shenoy's answer: When we perform the primary culture from the tumor biopsy we get a mix culture of cancer associate fibroblasts/stromal cells, and epithelial cells. We then perform differential trypsinization and separate the two cells types. If the epithelial cells survive for at least 2-3 passages we can consider them as cell line and can be used for various experiments.
- Prof. Seshagiri: In your second objective, you mentioned CAF? Please expand this in the protocol. Also, it is imperative that you should mention about the clinical phenotypes of the biopsy tissues
- Dr. Shenoy's answer: CAF: Cancer associate fibroblasts. When we collect the biopsy from the oral cavity we will be mentioning the tumor site, nodal involvement and metastasis (TNM).
- Dr. Bhanu: Just to reinforce that there should be some stringent inclusion/exclusion criteria while selecting clinical phenotypes
- > Dr. Shenoy's answer:

Inclusion criteria:

- 1) Healthy subjects enrolled in the study as control.
- 2) All patients having advanced stage oral squamous cell carcinoma

Exclusion criteria:

- Patients with human immunodeficiency virus or hepatitis B virus infections will be excluded.
- 2) Patients with SCCs that either has or had in past any other malignancy.
- 3) Patients with terminal period of a disease and

Clarifications requested from the committee:

- Prof. Wani: You have planned in vitro experiments. I think, there is a lot of literature might be available with in vitro data. Are you planning in vivo experiments to validate your hypothesis? For example: you can take nude mice and perform an orthotropic transplantation of cancers and characterize the CSCs in tissues. May it be its worth to characterize the cancer stem cells in different tissues?
 - **Dr. Bose's answer:** We have now checked the literature. As per the best of our understanding there is no literature available as of now regarding the CSC tropism of breast and colon CSC. Hence, we intend to use breast and colon CSCs for our study. It is a very good suggestion to validate our hypothesis using orthotropic cancer stem cell models. However, currently, we want to generate sufficient in-vitro mechanistic data before proceeding towards animal studies.
- Prof. Wani: Are you going to do cell sorting to separate the cancer stem cells and tumour cells?
 - **Dr. Bose's answer:** Yes, we will perform fluorescence activated cell sorting (FACS) to separate cancer stem cells from non-stem cancer cells. Before performing FACS, we will assess the percentage of cancer stem cells using analytic flow Cytometry.
- Dr. Suresh: Why do we have to do the bone marrow transplantation in leucoporosis patients? What's the reason? What conditions do these leucoporosis patients? How does the disease phenotype influence your interpretation of results with the specific CD markers you are investigating in your current study? This needs to be addressed. Dr. Bose's answer: There is no-disease/term called 'Leucoporosis' to the best of our knowledge and understanding. In my opinion, the learned reviewer wrongly heard "Leucoporosis" as "Leucoporosis". Bone marrow transplantations are mostly carried
 - "Leukapheresis" as "Leucoporosis". Bone marrow transplantations are mostly carried out in haematological disorders. Hence, rest of the questions are not valid. Regarding "Leukapheresis", it is a technology in which the apheresis machine draws the complete peripheral blood from the patient, separates out only one component (here the WBC) are separated and rest of the blood is returned back the patient. The systemic circulation, in this case is mobilized by cytokines such as G-CSF or GM-CSF so that the CD34+ cells from the bone-marrow appear abundantly in the peripheral blood. This technique has been used routinely since decades to harvest.

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CD34+ cells. In our study, also, the clinician collects the CD34+ cells using leukopheresis.

- > Dr. Suresh: You had mentioned co-culture of cells? Is it possible to co-culture these cells? Are you using conditioned medium? Please clarify.
- Dr. Bose's answer: Yes, we will use both co-culture and conditioned media. For co-culturing, transwell plates will be used. For conditioned media, we will culture the CSCs in bulk and then use the spent media as the conditioned media for growing the CD34+ stem/progenitor cells.
- Prof. Seshagiri: You are doing CD24 and CD44 enrichment to get CSCs population, what % of cells you get as an input to start?
- Dr. Bose's answer: For pre-sorting validation we go for analytical flow cytometry, there we assess the percentage of cancer stem cells present in the heterogeneous or parent population. In our study, the commercially available colorectal cancer lines (HT-29 and HCT-15) were assessed for the percentage of CD44+ cell population. We found CD44+ cell percentage was 62.7% in HT-29 and 35.52% in HCT-15 cell line, respectively (See attached Annexure 1, section-1A) for details on published results from our laboratory
- Prof. Seshagiri: From my understanding, I think, it is a very less population of CSCs, even in cancer cell-lines? May be your CD24 and CD44 may give you a higher % of CSC? and these CD24 and CD44 may also be present in normal cancer cells?
- ▶ Dr. Bose's answer: The percentage of the CSC population is not very less. Actually, it's a high percentage of CSC present in the commercially available cell lines such as MDA-MB-468 and MDA-MB-231. To corroborate our findings, there is an earlier report suggesting ~ 90% CSCs. Chu et al., 2018, found reported 92% of CSCs in MDA-MB-468 cell line, Similarly, in our study (Sen et al.,2020) we have identified and isolated 80% of cancer stem cells from TNBC lines (See attached Annexure 1, section-1B)
- Prof. Seshagiri: I am not sure about the discriminatory power of CD44 and CD24 in isolating CSCs and I feel, you should have a very specific CD marker to isolate your CSCs. Please check the literature and clarify.
- Dr. Bose's answer: The combination of CD44 and CD24, or aldehyde dehydrogenase 1 (ALDH1) alone, is a widely used cancer stem cell marker in breast cancer. However, no conclusion has yet been reached as to which marker is the best for characterizing cancer stemness (See attached Annexure 1, section-1C for details on the fature).

Prof. Seshagiri: There are 2 different experimental systems in the study: 1. Two different cell types co-cultures 2. The CD34 cells being exposed to conditioned media of the CSCs isolated from colon or breast. This experimentation seems huge. Hence, in terms of the numbers, how many n number of times you would perform these experiments?

- Dr. Bose's answer: We plan to perform the experiment in triplicates. Please find the table in Annexure-A for the plan of experiments. Indeed, the experimentation work appears to be huge. However, we plan to split it up into small segments and perform experiments in a staggered manner, possibly for one cell line at a time for a span of say 6 months. So, in total for all four cell types, we plan to take 2-3 years to finish the work.
- Prof. Seshagiri: Are you actually going to work with colon or breast cancer excised tissues? It is not a part of this, right? Please clarify.
- Dr. Bose's answer: No, we do not want to use excised tissue from colon or breast cancer. Only CSCs isolated from the commercially available cell lines will be used for this study.
- Dr Suresh: For this study, is it essential to know the specific haematological disorder for which BMT is done and BMT can be autologous/allogeneic?
- Dr. Bose's answer: (as responded by the clinician Co-PI Dr Rajesh): The transplants currently planned are autologous (patient's own stem cells to be mobilized after they are treated with chemotherapy and have achieved remission. Autologous stem cell transplant is done to increase depth of response and kills residual cancer cells. Autologous transplant is basically a rescue regimen using collected and cryopreserved stem cells for high dose chemotherapy which wipes out patients stem cells whilst killing residual cancer cells. The haematological disorders will be lymphoma, myeloma or neuroblastoma.
- Dr Suresh: Mobilization regimens are different based on the underlying haematological disease and prior treatment (non hodgkins/MM etc.,)
- Dr. Bose's answer: (as responded by the Clinician Co-PI Dr Rajesh): The stem cell mobilisation regime will be same for all patients. It will be GCSF (granulocyte colony stimulating factor-G-CSF) along with plerixafor.

There was a discussion on projected budget that needs to be included by the PIs for their own benefit to understand the feasibility of executing the proposed objectives.

Conclusion:

Towards the conclusion, the chairman enquired with the members, if there are any further comments/suggestions on the projects discussed in the meeting. Since there were none from the members, the following points were discussed on progress of the 3 previously sanctioned projects:

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- Chairman enquired with the members, if they have any comments on the progress of the 3 previously sanctioned projects that were submitted to the committee by the individual project PIs.
- 2. Chairman, Dr. Wani and other members also made a point that the progress reports of previously approved projects are satisfactory.
- 3. Chairman also mentioned about the missing project registration numbers in the submitted documents.
- 4. In addition, Dr. Chairman made a point that annual reports of the IC-SCR meetings conducted along with project approvals and status of ongoing projects, has to be sent to NAC-SCRT, New Delhi.
- 5. Dr. Bhanu: made a general comment that the PIs of the projects, may think of adding a translational value to the projects that they are proposing to the committee in future as this would further enhance the project translational applicability.
- 6. Dr. Smita: commented on the progress of pancreatic beta cell project and suggested that it fine to use NTERA-2 cells for optimization experiments but may not be accepted as the project deals with differentiation of human pluripotent stem cells and their differentiations to pancreatic beta cells.
- 7. Dr. Bipasha's response: They had procured human pluripotent stem cell line from Thailand and they failed to culture them. However, they bought human pluripotent stem cell line from Thermo fisher Scientific, which are in culture and the experiments will be reproduced in these cells.
- 8. An additional comment from the committee-concerning the pancreatic beta cell project was that PI Dr. Bipasha Bose could think of using at least two different human pluripotent stem cell lines to validate the differentiations as this add on the significance and reproducibility of the findings and also could help the PI during manuscript publication.
- 9. Chairman made a general comment and appreciated that he observed a good blend of basic scientists and clinicians coming together to design the stem cell related program and suggested that YRC should cache in on nucleating this activity in a big way and generate some external funds to run some of these research programs. Chairman thanked the PIs for their participation and requested them to leave.
