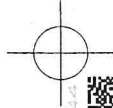

SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Service Agreement (“**Agreement**”) is entered on this the 28th day of December, 2020 (“**Execution Date**”)

BY AND BETWEEN

Indeanta Ventures Private Limited having its registered office at 301, 3rd Floor, Sai Soukya Polo Garden, No. 1/1, Upper line, Sheshadripuram, Bangalore, 560020 Karnataka, India (hereinafter referred to as “**Promoters/Service Provider/Indeanta**” which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, include and mean its successors & permitted assigns) of the One Part;

And

Yenepoya University(deemed to be), a part of Yenepoya Group, University Road, Deralakatte, Mangalore – 575018, a trust formed under the Indian Trust Act, 1882, represented by its authorised signatory, Mr. Gangadhar Somayaji, holding the designation of “**Registrar**” having its office at University Road, Deralakatte, Mangalore (hereinafter referred to as “**Customer**” which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, include and mean its successors & permitted assigns) of the Other Part;

The Service Provider and the Customer may be collectively referred to as “**Parties**” and individually as “**Party**”.

WHEREAS:

- A. The Service Provider is engaged in the business of providing electric vehicles on contract basis to other businesses to for the use of its customers, staff, and others as per the terms and conditions of the contract;
- B. The Customer is a non-for-profit trust engaged in the business of providing medical education and running of a hospital and is desirous of availing the Service in its premise located at the address first written above for itself (“**Premise**”) (detailed in **Annexure 1** to this Agreement);
- C. The Service Provider has represented to the Customer that it possesses specialized skill, knowledge and expertise in providing the Services and is interested in providing such services to the Customer;
- D. On such representation from the Service Provider, the Customer has agreed to obtain the services of Service Provider and Service Provider has agreed to render the same as per the terms and conditions set forth hereinafter in this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1.DEFINITIONS:

“Agreement” shall mean this Agreement including its annexures and all amendments and modifications thereto made in accordance with the provisions hereof or which are incorporated herein expressly by reference.

“Electric Vehicles” shall mean two (2) electric cars, two (2) electric buggies, ten (10) electric bicycles and twenty-five (25) electric scooters as detailed in **Annexure 3** hereto.

“Intended Purpose” shall mean use of the electric car(s) is for staff and student transport. The intended use of the electric buggies is for patients and their bystanders, senior citizens, staff and students within the Premise. The intended use for electric bicycles and electric scooters for transport of staff and students, point to point, within the Premise and between the Premise and the hostel.

“Person” shall mean any individual, partnership Corporation Company, unincorporated organization or association, trust or other entity, including a Government or a political subdivision or an agency or instrumentality thereof.

“Personal Data” Shall mean any data relating to a person who can be identified either from the data directly, or from that data together with other information that is either likely to be available.

Personal data covers any information that can identify an individual such as identification numbers, PAN Numbers and shall include name, pseudonyms, address, telephone number, any identity card number, occupation and shall also include:

- i. password;
- ii. financial information such as bank account or credit card or debit card or other payment instrument details;
- iii. physical, physiological and mental health condition;
- iv. sexual orientation;
- v. medical records and history;
- vi. Biometric information;
- vii. any detail relating to the above clauses as provided to body corporate for providing service; and

viii. any of the information received under above clauses by body corporate for processing, stored or processed under lawful contract or otherwise:

Personal Data is each piece of information related to the individual, regardless of the form in which it is expressed and the format in which it is kept in or on the information holder (storage media, paper, tape, film, electronic media, etc).

However, any information that is freely available or accessible in public domain or furnished under the Right to Information Act, 2005 or any other law for the time being in force shall not be regarded as personal data.

“**Service**” shall mean the services provided by the Service Provider to the Customer as detailed in Annexure hereto.

1. **APPOINTMENT:**

The Customer does hereby appoint the Service Provider on exclusive basis to render the Services at the locations specified in the **Annexure I** of this Agreement.

2. **TERM:**

The term of this Agreement shall commence from the Execution Date and continue until a period of three (3) years from the Execution Date (the “**Term**”), unless terminated earlier as per the provisions of this Agreement. The Parties may extend the term of this Agreement on such mutually agreed terms and conditions as may be entered into in writing.

3. **SCOPE OF WORK:**

- 3.1 The Service Provider hereby agrees to provide to the Customer the Services for the Intended Purpose. The Service Provider further agrees that as and when required by the Customer it shall provide to the Customer such other services that are incidental to the Services for a consideration, provided however; such other services shall be agreeable to the Customer and the same shall be agreed to in writing between the Parties.
- 3.2 The Service Provider agrees to perform its obligations and duties in terms of this Agreement faithfully and diligently.
- 3.3 The Customer agrees to perform its obligations, including the due and timely payment of all consideration under this Agreement faithfully and diligently.

3.4 If the Service Provider requires any of its employees, agents, contractors, or such other persons etc. to enter any location of the Customer, the Service Provider shall ensure, at all times, that they act and perform the duties professionally and in line with the Customer's working practices and shall adhere to any security procedures in force at the location.

4. CONSIDERATION:

4.1 In consideration of the Services to be performed by the Service Provider, the Customer shall pay to the Service Provider, the Fees as detailed in **Annexure 2** hereto, subject to deduction of applicable taxes ("Fees").

4.2 Except GST, all other taxes, duties and levies applicable in respect of this Agreement shall be borne by the Service Provider.

4.3 For the payment of the said Fees, the Service Provider shall raise an invoice on the Customer at the rates specified in **Annexure II** to this Agreement and the Customer shall settle the said undisputed invoice within seven (7) days of its receipt.

4.4 The Service Provider shall raise separate invoices for different scope of services carried out under this Agreement.

4.5 In the event of any disputes between the Parties as regards to any Fees or charges, the Customer shall pay the undisputed amount and the Parties shall promptly seek to resolve such disputed fees and/or charges.

CONDITIONS PRECEDENT:

4.6 The Service Provider shall provide two (2) electric bicycles and two (2) electric scooters on a demo/trial basis, and from the Execution Date or within fifteen (15) days from the Execution Date, it is agreed between the Parties that the Service Provider shall provide Customer with two (2) electric cars, two (2) electric buggies, eight (8) electric bicycles and twenty-three (23) electric scooters. The electric cars will be provided by the Service Provider to the customer on 1st of April 2021, as requested by the customer.

4.7 The Service Provider shall obtain receipt of clearance/no objection certificate from the engineer/official representatives of the company providing the Electric Vehicles with regard to usage conditions within the Premise.

CONDITIONS ANTECEDENT:

4.8 The Service Provider and the Customer hereby agree that at the end of the contractual period of 3 years from the date of execution of this agreement, The vehicles provided by the Service Provider to the Customer will be offered to the customer for ownership, if the customer so desires, at a nominal price to be decided by mutual consent between both parties. If the customer decides to renew the contract with the service provider then said vehicles continue to remain in the ownership of the Service Provider until such time as the contract is valid.

5. INDEPENDENT SERVICE PROVIDER RELATIONSHIP:

Service Provider's relationship with the Customer will be that of an independent Service Provider and nothing in this Agreement should be construed to create a partnership, joint venture, or employer-employee relationship. Service Provider is not the agent of Customer and is not authorized to make any representation, contract, or commitment on behalf of Customer. Service Provider will ensure that all of its employees have all necessary permits, licenses, insurance, or other documents necessary to render the Services under this Agreement.

6. CONFIDENTIALITY:

The term "**Confidential Information**" shall mean any information disclosed or provided by either Party (the "**Disclosing Party**") to the other Party ("**Receiving Party**") in connection with this Agreement that is disclosed in writing, orally or by inspection and whether or not identified as "Confidential" or "Proprietary", which is of a confidential or proprietary nature or which a reasonable person would believe should be treated as such. All technical or business information furnished or disclosed, in whatever form or medium, by Disclosing Party to the Receiving Party, including but not limited to trademarks, trade names, logos, and designs, computer programs (source code, object code and listings), reports, documentation, drawings, models, work-in-progress, product/service specifications, prototypes, personnel statistics, marketing and strategic information, proprietary research data and financial plans and analyses, information concerning customers, trade secrets, methods, processes or procedures of the Disclosing Party, or its financial information, whether or not specifically identified herein, shall be treated as Confidential Information. The Receiving Party will only disclose Confidential Information to those of its affiliates and its and their respective directors, officers, employees, advisors, agents and contractors (collectively, "**Representatives**") who have a need to know for the purpose of performing services under this Agreement. The Receiving Party shall (i) cause its Representatives to maintain the confidentiality of the Confidential Information in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, (ii) be responsible for any breach of this Agreement by any of its Representatives and (iii) take all reasonable measures to restrain its Representatives from prohibited or unauthorized disclosure or

use of the Confidential Information. The Receiving Party will protect the confidentiality of Confidential Information using the same degree of care, but no less than reasonable care, as it uses to protect its own confidential or proprietary information. The obligations set forth in this section will not apply to any portion of the Confidential Information that: (a) was independently developed by the Receiving Party without any use of the Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party and by employees or other agents of (or independent contractors hired by) the Receiving Party who have not been exposed to the Confidential Information; (b) becomes known to the Receiving Party, without restriction, from a third party without breach of this Agreement and, who had to the best of Receiving Party's knowledge, a right to disclose it; (c) was in the public domain at the time it was disclosed or becomes in the public domain through no act or omission of the Receiving Party; or (d) was rightfully known to the Receiving Party, without restriction, at the time of disclosure.

Notwithstanding the foregoing or any other provision of this Agreement, nothing contained herein shall prevent the Receiving Party or its Representatives from disclosing all or any portion of Confidential Information as required pursuant to any law or the order or requirement of a court, administrative agency, or other governmental body; provided, however, that the Receiving Party shall, to the extent permissible by law, provide prompt notice thereof to the Disclosing Party and shall use its reasonable best efforts, at Disclosing Party's expense, to obtain a protective order or otherwise prevent public disclosure of such information.

7. INTELLECTUAL PROPRIETARY RIGHTS:

The Service Provider may/shall create, at its convenience and at its sole discretion, a mobile application, including any additions, upgrades or substitutes (hereinafter referred to as "App") thereof on a no-ownership and non-transferrable and non-assignable basis only for the purpose of rendering services under this Agreement. Such App shall always be the proprietary software of the Service Provider and the Customer shall not acquire any rights whatsoever on the same.

All agreements, information collected/processed and/or improvements, including but not limited to the App for performing its obligations under this Agreement shall be in the absolute ownership of the Service Provider and the Customer shall have no claims with respect to any intellectual property during the Term and shall belong absolutely to and be the sole property of the Customer.

The Customer agrees that the terms contained herein are special, unique and extraordinary and any breach of violation of these terms shall cause the Service Provider irreparable injury.

8. OWNERSHIP OF INNOVATIONS:

Provided that the fees as per the terms of this Agreement are paid in full to the Service Provider, the Service Provider agrees that to the fullest extent legally permissible, all deliverables resulting directly from the provision of Services (“**Innovations**”) under this agreement will be owned by the Service Provider, which may, transfer such ownership or a license to such Innovations in its discretion.

9. SERVICE AND MAINTENANCE:

The Service Provider shall be responsible for undertaking the service and maintenance of the Electric Vehicles during the Term. During the demo/trial period as contemplated in clause 5 above, the service and maintenance shall be undertaken by the Customer should there be any damages to the Electric Vehicles.

10. DRIVERS AND FUELLING:

The Customer hereby agrees and undertakes that it shall hire qualified drivers to drive the Electric Vehicles, as maybe required, within the Premise and outside the Premise, if applicable and further undertakes that it shall be the sole responsibility of the Customer to fuel the Electric Vehicles during the Term. For the purpose of Electric Vehicles, Fuel/Fueling means providing electric points and making electricity available at all times for the purpose of ensuring the functioning of the Electric Vehicles.

11. REPRESENTATION AND WARRANTIES:

Each Party represents warrants and covenants that:

- a) it has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to perform its obligations hereunder;
- b) execution of and performance under this Agreement shall not breach any oral or written agreement with any third party; and
- c) it will comply with all applicable laws and industry standard.

12. INDEMNIFICATION:

The Parties hereby agree to indemnify each other to the fullest extent permitted by law and to save hold harmless the other, from and in respect of all reasonable fees,

costs and expenses including legal fee paid in connection with or resulting from any claim, action, or demand against the aggrieved Party other that arises out of or in any way relates to any action taken by the other or any act or omission on the part of the other Party during the Term.

13. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY:

In no event or under any circumstance shall either Party, its directors, officers or employees be liable to the other Party or to any third person claiming rights derived from such Party's rights, in contract, tort or otherwise, for indirect, special, incidental, exemplary, punitive or consequential damages of any kind whatsoever even if advised of the possibility of such damages.

14. INSURANCE:

Service Provider shall maintain at its own cost and expense throughout the Term of the Agreement and any extensions thereof, adequate insurance policies to insure its potential liabilities and relevant risks under this Agreement and as may be customary in the business in which the Service Provider is engaged. Unless expressly mentioned in this Agreement and subject to clause 9 herein, the Customer shall not be liable for undertaking such insurances for the Electric Vehicles.

15. TERMINATION:

This Agreement shall terminate on the date of the earliest occurrence of either of the following events:

- (i) expiration of this Agreement upon expiry of the Term or any renewal terms (as the case may be); or
- (ii) termination in accordance with the provisions herein of this Agreement.

16. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Governing Law: This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of India, without regard to conflicts of laws principles. The Courts in Mangalore shall have exclusive jurisdiction to try any dispute relating to this Agreement.

Jurisdiction: Any dispute or difference whatsoever arising between the Parties out of or relating to the construction, meaning, scope, operation or effect of this contract or the validity or the breach thereof shall be settled to the extent possible by arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration Rules of India. The law governing the arbitration

proceedings shall be Indian law and the proceedings shall be held at Mangalore and/or Bangalore and conducted in the English language. For the same, each party shall appoint one arbitrator for resolving such difference. The award rendered by the arbitrators will be final and binding on the Parties hereto.

However, in the event the disputes cannot be resolved through arbitration, the same shall be resolved in the Court of Law and the Courts of Mangalore shall have absolute jurisdiction to hear and resolve such disputes.

Assignment:

The Parties shall not assign this agreement without prior written consent of the other.

Severability:

If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be invalid or unenforceable to any extent for any reason including by reason of any law or regulation or Government policy or any amendment thereof, the remainder of this Agreement and the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable shall not be affected thereby, and each provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law. Any invalid or unenforceable provision of this Agreement shall be replaced with a provision that is valid and enforceable and most nearly reflects the original intent of the unenforceable provision.

Survival:

The following clauses of the Agreement shall survive termination of the Agreement, Clause 15 (Termination), Clause 6 (Confidential Information), Clause 7 (Intellectual Proprietary Rights), Clause 12 (Indemnification), and this Clause 16 (General Provisions).

Injunctive Relief:

A breach of the provisions of this Agreement may result in irreparable and continuing damage to the Party who has been harmed for which there may be no adequate remedy at law, and such Party is therefore entitled to seek injunctive relief as well as such other and further relief as may be appropriate.

Notice:

All notices, requests and other communications under this Agreement must be in writing, and must be mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid and return receipt



requested, or delivered to the party to whom such notice is required or permitted to be given. All Notices shall be deemed delivered (a) when actually received if personally delivered with acknowledgement; (b) when actually received, if sent by registered or certified mail as evidenced by acknowledgement. The mailing address for notice to either Party will be the address as mentioned first above. Either Party may change its mailing address by notice as provided by this section.

Waiver:

No waiver by either Party of any breach of this Agreement shall be a waiver of any preceding or succeeding breach. No waiver by either Party of any right under this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver of any other right. Customer shall not be required to give notice to enforce strict adherence to all terms of this Agreement.

Entire Agreement:



Annexure 2

Service Fees

The Customer shall pay the following to the Service Provider in accordance with clause 4 hereto:

- i. Rs. 40,000 per month per electric car, without driver during the Term;
- ii. Rs. 21,000 per month per electric buggy, without driver during the Term;
- iii. Rs. 1,750 per month per electric cycle, without driver during the Term; and
- iv. Rs. 2,250 per month per electric scooter, without driver during the Term;

*Consideration with respect to electric cycles and electric scooters are subject to vary and will be captured by an amendment to this Agreement and the Customer is aware of the same and undertakes to promptly execute such amendment thereof.

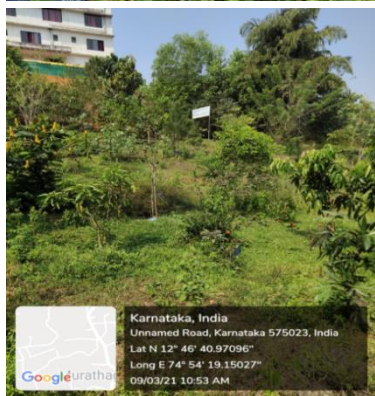
