INTRODUCTION

Yenepoya University is the first deemed University in the district of Dakshina Kannada, in the south of Karnataka in India. The University is recognized by the Ministry of Human Resource Development and the University Grants Commission, vide Gazette Notification No. F/9-11/2007.U.3 (A), UGC Act 1956 dated 27 February 2008 and accredited by NAAC with 'A' Grade. Presently, the University is engaged in health care education.

Established in 1991 as the Islamic Academy of Education, it started a Dental College in 1992, Nursing Institute in 1997, Medical College in 1999, another Nursing College in 2002 and a Physiotherapy College in 2003. Among its many strong points, Yenepoya University has established the Centre for Ethics, dedicated to bioethics education and research. The Centre will foster a renaissance movement in the field of ethics thereby leading

to a paradigm shift in the approach of the various stakeholders towards ethics in health care and research.

The Centre is interdisciplinary in nature and situated uniquely amongst the health care institutions in the university to enrich their respective curricula. Bioethics education is taught in the global context yet retaining the local relevance. The Centre also performs extension activities in mentoring the development of ethics committees across the country. Innovative teaching requires innovations in educational strategies and the Centre empowers students through critical evaluation of movies, documentaries, paintings, interviews and case discussions.

Establishment

In 2007-08, Dr Vina Vaswani, Professor & Head, Department of Forensic Medicine & Toxicology, was permitted by the Yenepoya Medical College Management to pursue Masters in Bioethics as an Erasmus Mundus student (an initiative from European Union). In 2010 a proposal was mooted by Department of Forensic Medicine to host the Centre for Ethics to establish ethics courses and place Yenepoya University on the global map of bioethics education, as a pioneer in the country. Yenepoya University took the bold innovative initiative to create a Centre for Ethics in February 2011 for mainstreaming Bioethics education and to strengthen research in interdisciplinary field of Bioethics.

University Patronage

Appreciating the gap in the ethics education, Yenepoya University approved and allocated space and infrastructure to start the Post Graduate Diploma in Bioethics Medical Ethics. The international collaboration with Johannes Gutenberg University resulted in starting of certificate course in Clinical Ethics Consultation and hosting of an international faculty and student exchange programme. By this leadership role and the patronage to ethics today, Centre for Ethics has eminent bioethicists visiting the Centre conducting courses and academic programmes.

Vision

The vision of Centre for Ethics, Yenepoya University is to bring bioethics into the mainstream of all health care academics, clinical and research applications. It will strive to bring ethics to the forefront of conscious thought in all people engaged in healthcare services, thereby bringing about a stronger and more transparent ethics-based health care delivery. The Centre will stay committed to educating and increasing awareness of general public and laypersons.

Mission

The mission of the Centre for Ethics is to inculcate in all professionals, a sense of ethical responsibility towards their job, family and society thereby making them better citizens, in a global sense, through a process of change management and collaborative leadership.

Objectives

The objectives of the Centre for Ethics are:

- To promote ethical concepts among the various stakeholders in the University and foster a sense of ethical practices that will enhance quality of health care.
- To train individuals in the fields of Bioethics, Medical Ethics, Health Care Ethics, Clinical Ethics, Research Ethics, Environmental Ethics and other inter-disciplinary areas, empowering them with skills necessary for resolving ethical problems.
- To support the clinicians in the form of clinical ethics consultation and encourage trans-cultural explorations of ethical practices and assist the stakeholders in accepting different viewpoints, however digressive.
- To provide a platform for inter-disciplinary dialogue in ethics and thereby promote national values of professional and ethical leadership.
- To explore the possibilities of conducting research in different fields of ethics and encouraging collaborative research.
- To seek out similar centre /departments and enter into collaborative partnerships with them for academics, research and publication.

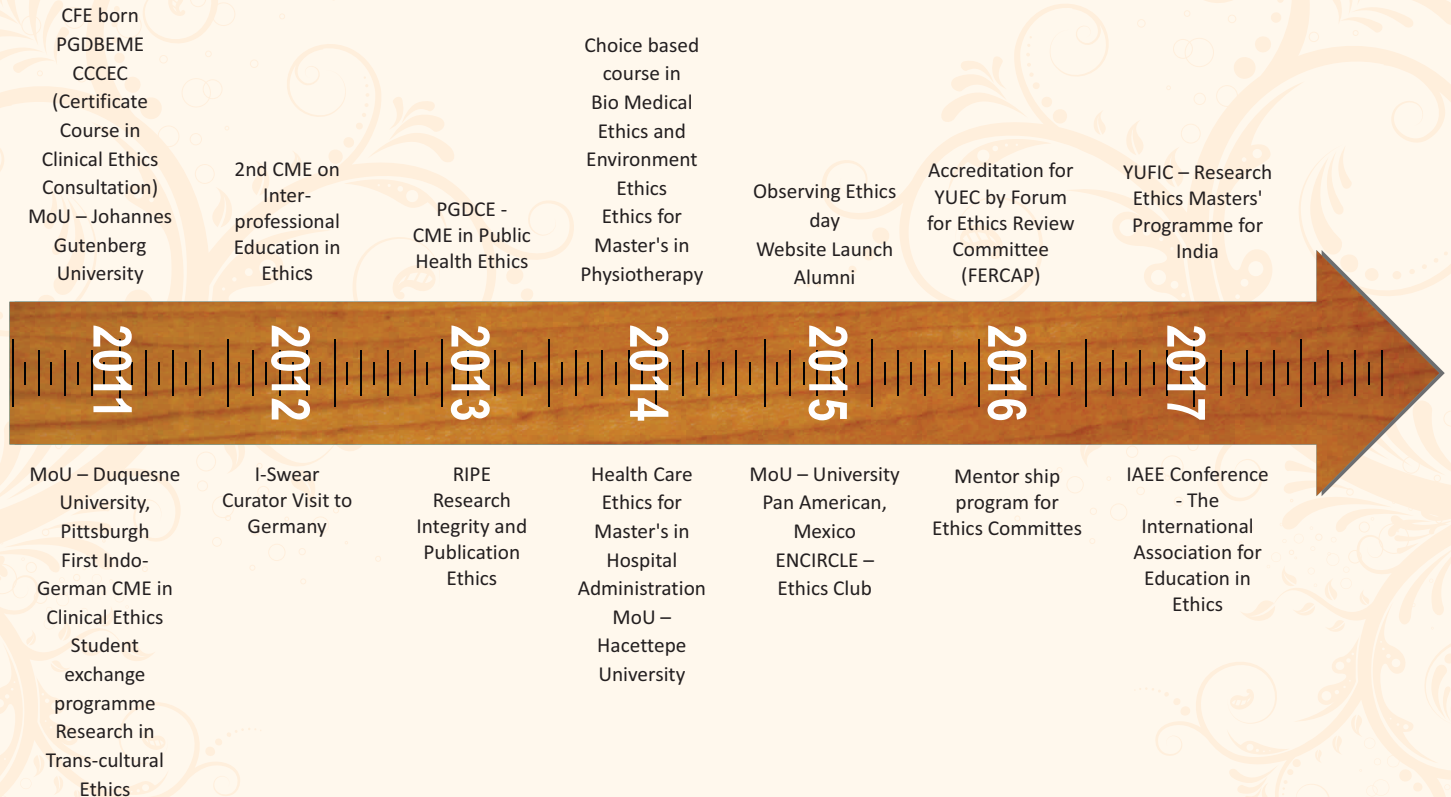

The Centre for Ethics offers several academic programs in ethics education since 2011

Post graduate Diploma in Bioethics and Medical Ethics (PGDBEME)

The PGDBEME is a one-year contact program based academic course that is reinforced by field visits and mock reviews.

This program begins every January and covers all the areas of bioethics such as morality, theories of ethics, duty-based ethics, research ethics and clinical ethics.

The trainees undergo one year practical based intensive training following which they are awarded a PG diploma degree. Trainee carries out a research project under guidance and attend an assessment exam in the month of December.





Post Graduate Diploma in Clinical Ethics

Since 2011 November, the Centre was running a Certificate Course in Clinical Ethics Consultation (CCCEC) Dr. Norbert W Paul, Professor and Director of the Department of History, Philosophy and Ethics of Medicine, Johannes Gutenberg University, Mainz, Germany. is the visiting Professor at the Centre for Ethics Department. Additionally Dr. Anand Zachariah, Sr. Professor of Medicine, Christian Medical College, Vellore, was also a resource faculty. This was a six-month academic program enabling the participants to be familiar with the ethical issues in health care practices. Since 2013 the Certificate Course has been converted to a Post Graduate Diploma course and runs for one year on the same design as the Post Graduate Diploma in Bioethics & Medical Ethics. Clinical ethics is covered in depth and the participant will be trained to successfully run a clinical ethics consultation in his/her institution.

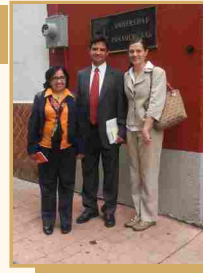

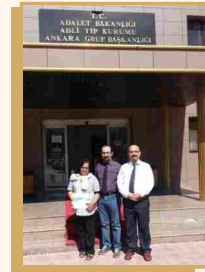

Intensive Summer Workshop on Ethics & Research (I-SWEAR)

Today, much of the world's clinical are conducted in Asian countries. India ranks as a top country for providing a huge market of participants and at costs significantly lesser. The commensurate with this burst in clinical trials, ethics committees have also sprouted across the country. The problem is that majority of the members who sit in these ethics committees to sanction ethical clearance to clinical trials are not trained in the process of ethical clearances and the fixing of compensation, in case of harm to participants.

Hence Centre for Ethics, Yenepoya University conceived Intensive Summer Workshop on Ethics & Research (I-SWEAR) with the vision of training researchers as well as ethics committee members in the skills required to carry out research in ethical manner and to learn how to perform better on ethics committees. Since 2012, during the month of May, the Centre for Ethics has been conducting this annual training program with National and International faculty

The workshop is structured using the current guidelines of the Indian Council of Medical Research, the Schedule Y of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, the ICH-GCP and other relevant national and international bodies.

Applied Ethics for Bachelor in Physiotherapy (BPT) Interns

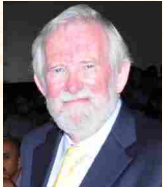


Following the basic training during the BPT curriculum, the Centre for Ethics engages Interns in interactive and self developing case scenarios in the area of applied Bioethics

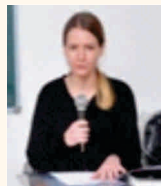

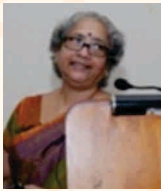

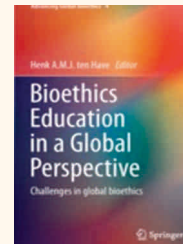
Qualitative Research Ethics – Faculty Development Program

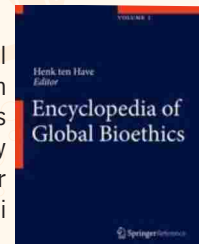

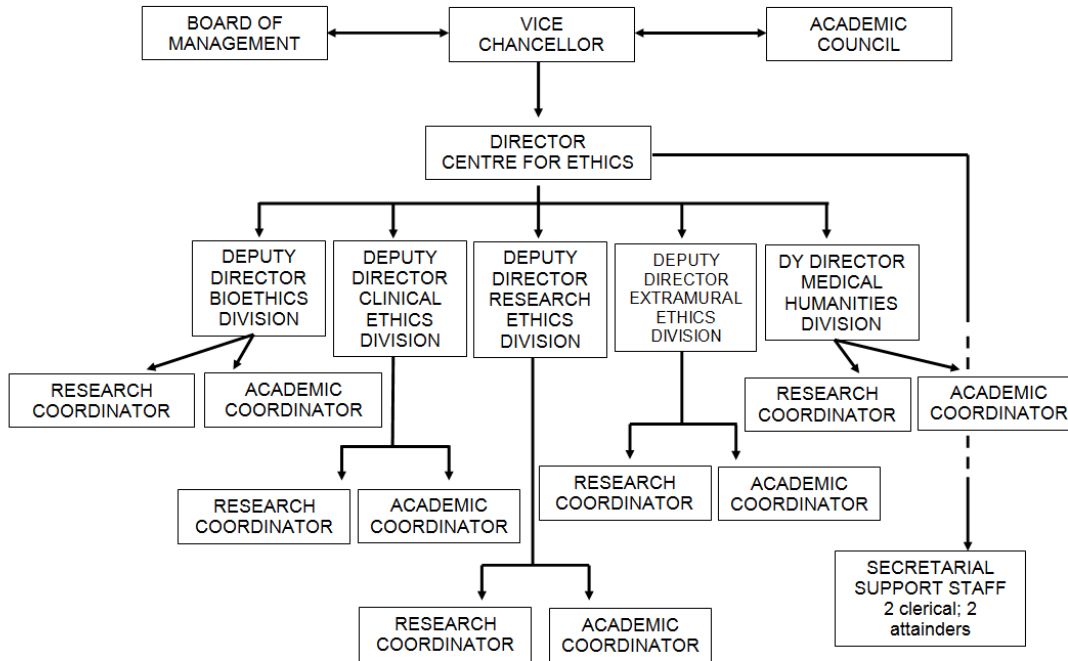
